

SHIPBUILDING: GENOESE DE WAVE BUYS FCR FINLAND



(ANSA) – GENOA, APRIL 13 – The Genoese group De Wave continues its growth plan and announces the landing in Finland with the acquisition of Fcr Finland, 28 million in turnover and about fifty employees, which has been operating for over a decade in the cruise sector, in particular in the construction of public areas and cabins on large passenger ships. A step that marks the entry into the Northern European and Scandinavian shipbuilding market, focusing in particular on the refitting of large cruise ships. “Our acquisition plan is proceeding at full speed and is destined for a further step forward. It is the market that requires increasingly global profiles in order to be able to successfully face the challenges of the future” explains the CEO of De Wave, Riccardo Pompili.

New acquisitions are expected. The transaction with FCR Finland, which will retain its management, “strengthens our international position – continues Pompili – allows us a strong alliance with one of the main players in Northern Europe and guarantees us to be able to look at new additional operations from a point of view. even greater strength “. The De Wave group, the result of the aggregation of three historic naval furniture brands (De Wave, Precetti and Spencer Contract), today totally controlled by the American investment fund Platinum Equity, in March had already acquired Tecnavi, a Genoese company operating in the naval plant engineering segment. With the entry of FCR Finland this year the total turnover could reach 300 million, against 210 million in 2021. (ANSA).
